

Princess Bride Tube Scarf

For Jimmy Beans Wool

This fun and easy-to-make Tube Scarf helps take some of the pain out of choosing which of the cute “Princess Bride”-themed colors to use for a quick project! The scarf is knit in the round with two colors of Shepherd Worsted in rodents... no, we mean stripes... of unusual size.

And the best part: Since the scarf is knit in the round, there are no ends to darn in... they all hide inside!

There are two versions: “Lovers” for fans of Westley and Buttercup, and “Fighters” for those of you who are just dying to say “Inconceivable - Prepare to Dye!”

Can't decide? Make one of each and share with your BFF!

We used an Addi Express knitting machine to make things even faster, but the scarf can also be knit with DPNs or a long circular needle with a magic loop.

Materials:

- Set of DPNs or a long circular needle in 5mm / US 8 or an Addi Express knitting machine
- 1 Stitch marker, darning needle, crochet hook for fringe
- Lovers Version : 1 hank each of Lorna's Laces Cloudgate in “As You Wish” (A) and “Farm Boy” (B)
- Fighters Version: 1 hank each of Lorna's Laces Shepherd Worsted in “Inconceivable” (A) and “Prepare To Dye” (B)

Gauge: Not critical for this project.

Finished Measurements: About 3-3.5” wide and 65/90” long.

Instructions:

Scarf:

Cast on 22 stitches in color A, leaving a 10” tail. Join to knit in the round.

Knit one round, place marker to keep track. Then follow the stripe pattern below:

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Color A: 30 Rounds

Color B: 3 Rounds

Color A: 20 Rounds

Color B: 10 Rounds

Color A: 10 Rounds

Color B: 5 Rounds

Color A: 15 Rounds

Color B: 8 Rounds

Color A: 18 Rounds

Color B: 5 Rounds

**If working with Cloudgate, leave out this section:

Color A: 25 Rounds

Color B: 10 Rounds

Color A: 18 Rounds

Color B: 18 Rounds

Color A: 10 Rounds

Color B: 25 Rounds

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Color A: 5 Rounds

Color B: 18 Rounds

Color A: 8 Rounds

Color B: 15 Rounds

Color A: 5 Rounds

Color B: 10 Rounds

Color A: 3 Rounds

Color B: 20 Rounds

Color A: 5 Rounds

Color B: 30 Rounds

Finishing:

Once scarf is the desired length, bind off all stitches.

For the Lovers Version, pull yarn tail through all bound-off stitches and pull tight, but don't cut off. Repeat the same with the cast-on edge. Make two pom-poms and attach them to the ends of the scarf with the tails, then secure them.

For the Fighters Version, cut 20 20-inch lengths of your favorite color, or 10 of each – you can alternate or use one color on each end of the scarf. Fold each length in half twice (4 strands); in even intervals, pull the last fold of each length through both layers of the scarf and pull the ends through the loop just created. When all fringe is attached, cut evenly along the bottom.

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
