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# OUTLINE

Ideal project for Hedgehog Fibres Sock club yarns, past and present!

Simple in construction, this wrap lets your yarns shine and your mind rest. It's a very easy, enjoyable knit, with a great knitting rhythm.

Easily adaptable, in terms of length, width and colours. Try using yarns that are of similar weight for best results.

I have used Hedgehog Fibres Sock Yarn with one accent yarn for texture interest - Hedgehog Fibres Kidsilk Lace.



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**YARN:**

Gold-Cream-Charcoal version:

- 1 skein Hedgehog Fibres Sock yarn: Silence
- 1 skein Hedgehog Fibres Sock yarn: Vengeance
- 1 skein Hedgehog Fibres Sock yarn: Teacup
- 1 skein Hedgehog Fibres Sock yarn: Pollen
- 1 skein Hedgehog Fibres Kidsilk Lace: Cinder

Scrappy version: all partial skeins, little bits:

- Hedgehog Fibres Sock yarn: Silence, Graphite, Stone, Coral, Monarch
- Hedgehog Fibres Sock yarn past Club colours: Macaroon, Storm
- Hedgehog Fibres Sock yarn exclusives: Bike Bell (Stephen+Penelope Amsterdam), Better Than Tin (Simply Socks Yarn company, Fort Wayne, Indiana)
- Hedgehog Fibres Kidsilk Lace: Jelly
- Hedgehog Fibres Kidsilk Lace: Winter Thaw

**NEEDLE:**

4mm, circular or straight, knitted flat. If you are a tight knitter, 4.5mm needle.  
You might need to go up 0.5mm needle size to compensate for the Kidsilk being thinner.

**INSTRUCTIONS:**

**Cast on 125 stitches** using your preferred cast on method. I like German Twisted cast on using a larger needle, we want something nice and stretchy.

Now, it's very complicated:

**Row 1 (RS): \*k5, yo, k8, ssk, k5, k2tog, k8, yo\* 4 times, k5**

**Row 2 (WS): \*k5, p10\*, k5**

That's it!

**Repeat the two rows, changing colours as desired.**





If you like my Gold-Cream-Charcoal version, the colour sequence is as follows:

Colour A: Silence: 20 rows  
Colour B: Vengeance: 10 rows  
Colour C: Teacup: 16 rows  
Colour D: Cinder: 14 rows\*  
Colour B: Vengeance: 10 rows  
Colour E: Pollen: 14 rows  
Colour C: Teacup: 2 rows

repeat the above sequence 3 times. After that, double the number of rows per colour:

Colour A: Silence: 40 rows  
Colour B: Vengeance: 20 rows  
Colour C: Teacup: 32 rows  
Colour D: Cinder: 28 rows\*  
Colour B: Vengeance: 20 rows  
Colour E: Pollen: 28 rows  
Colour C: Teacup: 4 rows

Cinder is Hedgehog Fibres Kidsilk Lace yarn

This is where I cast off my scarf using a sewn cast off or other stretchy cast off method (Jeny's surprisingly stretchy cast off).

If you would like a longer scarf, you should still have leftovers and it should be enough for another short sequence.

If you'd like a narrower or wider scarf, the repeat is multiple of 30 stitches + 5 stitches.

Notes:

I like to spit-splice, and I strongly believe that with enough rubbing, even superwash yarn will work, so that's how I dealt with the ends. You can also use Russian Join or weave in your ends afterwards.

Whether you are using commercially dyed yarn or lovely hand-dyed skeins, please keep in mind that colours might bleed. Both examples bled a little pink on the cream yarns. It doesn't bother me much as it's barely noticeable. But if that's something that would concern you, knit up a sample and wash it as you would your finished item. Reds and crazy pinks tend to bleed the most.

Finishing:

Weave in your ends if needed, block lightly.
