



Unraveled Designs and Yarn

Materials

Fingering weight in 3 colors: Color A - 150 yards,
Color B - 170 yards, Color C - 280 yards
Shown in Madelinetosh Dandelion: Color A - Hosta
Blue, Color B - Cousteau, Color C - Seawash
US 4 circular needle (at least 32")
Yarn needle

Measurements

One size: 80" from tip to tip and 13.5" high

Gauge

20 stitches/40 rows = 4 inches in garter stitch,
after blocking.

Two alternating solid colors are striped together, punctuated by feather and fan lace sections in a third, coordinating variegated color. Or, you can use 3 solids in your favorite colors for an equally lovely effect! The garter and lace sections get larger as the shawl grows, a bit like ripples on the water. Hence the name Ripple Effect!

This long crescent shaped shawl can be worn draped cozily across the shoulders or wrapped scarf-like around the neck. In fingering weight yarn, it is the perfect light-weight, all-season accessory!

Glossary

k: knit

p: purl

m1l: Insert left needle, from front to back, under strand of yarn which runs between next stitch on left needle and last stitch on right needle; knit this stitch through back loop. 1 stitch increased.

m1r: Insert left needle, from back to front, under strand of yarn which runs between next stitch on left needle and last stitch on right needle; knit this stitch through front loop. 1 stitch increased.

k2tog: Knit 2 together

yo: yarn over

kfb: Knit into the front and back of the stitch

Pattern Notes:

During the garter stripe sections you can carry the two colors you are working with along the edge, however, you will need to cut them when you get to a lace section.

It is very easy to knit the edge of the shawl too tight, particularly on the side where you will be carrying 2 colors at the same time. I highly recommend doing a yarn over at the beginning of every row, and then dropping these yarn overs at the end of every row to allow for a little extra give on the edge.

Techniques

Picot Bind Off

Step 1: Cast on 2 stitches at the beginning of the row using the knitted cast on method.

Step 2: Bind off 4 stitches normally, including the 2 that you cast on.

Step 3: Slip the remaining stitch on your right needle back onto the left.

Repeat steps 1-3 until all stitches have been bound off.

Directions

With color A cast on 6 stitches

Setup row: k2, m1r, k2, m1l, k2 (8 stitches).

Join color B, but do not cut color A.

Garter Section 1

With Color B

Row 1 (rs): k1, m1r, k1, m1r, k to 2 stitches before end, m1l, k1, m1l, k1.

Row 2(ws): k1, m1r, knit to 1 stitch before end, m1l, k1.

With Color A

Row 3: Repeat row 1.

Row 4: Repeat row 2.

Repeat rows 1-4 until there are 98 stitches (15 garter ridges), ending with color B.

Lace Section 1

Join color C

Row 1: k1, m1r, k1, m1r, k to 2 stitches before end, m1l, k1, m1l, k1.

Row 2: k1, m1r, k1, purl to last 3 stitches, k1, m1l, k1

Row 3: k1, m1r, k1, m1r, k5, *(k2tog) 3 times (yo, k1) 6 times, (k2tog) 3 times. Repeat from * to last 7 stitches, k5, m1l, k1, m1l, k1.

Row 4: k1, m1r, k to one stitch before the end, m1l, k1

Row 5: Repeat row 1

Row 6: Repeat row 2

Row 7: k1, m1r, k1, m1r, k11, *(k2tog) 3 times (yo, k1) 6 times, (k2tog) 3 times. Repeat from * to last 13 stitches, k11, m1l, k1, m1l, k1.

Row 8: Repeat row 4.

Row 9: Repeat row 1.

Row 10: Repeat row 2.

Row 11: kfb, m1r, *(k2tog) 3 times (yo, k1) 6 times, (k2tog) 3 times. Repeat from * to last stitch, m1l, kfb.

Row 12: Repeat row 4. (134 stitches)

Garter Section 2

Join color B and repeat rows 1-4 from Garter

Section 1 until there are 212 stitches (13 garter ridges), ending with color B.

Directions (continued)

Lace Section 2

Join color C

Row 1: k1, m1r, k1, m1r, k to 2 stitches before end, m1l, k1, m1l, k1.

Row 2: k1, m1r, k1, purl to last 2 stitches, k1, m1l, k1

Row 3: k1, m1r, k1, m1r, k8, *(k2tog) 3 times (yo, k1) 6 times, (k2tog) 3 times. Repeat from * to last 10 stitches, k8, m1l, k1, m1l, k1.

Row 4: k1, m1r, k to one stitch before the end, m1l, k1

Row 5: Repeat row 1

Row 6: Repeat row 2

Row 7: k1, m1r, k1, m1r, k14, *(k2tog) 3 times (yo, k1) 6 times, (k2tog) 3 times. Repeat from * to last 16 stitches, k14, m1l, k1, m1l, k1.

Row 8: Repeat row 4.

Row 9: Repeat row 1.

Row 10: Repeat row 2.

Row 11: k1, m1r, k1, m1r, k2, *(k2tog) 3 times (yo, k1) 6 times, (k2tog) 3 times. Repeat from * to last 4 stitches, k2, m1l, k1, m1l, k1.

Row 12: Repeat row 4.

Row 13: Repeat row 1.

Row 14: Repeat row 2.

Row 15: Repeat row 3.

Row 16: Repeat row 4. (260 stitches)

Garter Section 3

Join color B and repeat rows 1-4 from Garter Section A until there are 350 stitches (15 ridges), ending with color B.

Lace Section 3

Join color C

Row 1: k1, m1r, k1, m1r, k to 2 stitches before end, m1l, k1, m1l, k1.

Row 2: k1, m1r, k1, purl to last 2 stitches, k1, m1l, k1

Row 3: k1, m1r, k1, m1r, k 5, *(k2tog) 3 times (yo, k1) 6 times, (k2tog) 3 times. Repeat from * to last 7 stitches, k 5, m1l, k1, m1l, k1.

Row 4: k1, m1r, k to one stitch before the end, m1l, k1.



Directions (continued)

Row 5: Repeat row 1

Row 6: Repeat row 2

Row 7: k1, m1r, k1, m1r, k 11, *(k2tog) 3 times (yo, k1) 6 times, (k2tog) 3 times. Repeat from * to last 13 stitches, k11, m1l, k1, m1l, k1.

Row 8: Repeat row 4.

Row 9: Repeat row 1.

Row 10: Repeat row 2.

Row 11: kfb, m1, *(k2tog) 3 times (yo, k1) 6 times, (k2tog) 3 times. Repeat from * to last stitch, m1, kfb.

Row 12: Repeat row 4.

Row 13: Repeat row 1.

Row 14: Repeat row 2.

Row 15: k1, m1r, k1, m1r, k5, *(k2tog) 3 times (yo, k1) 6 times, (k2tog) 3 times. Repeat from * to last 7 stitches, k5, m1l, k1, m1l, k1.

Row 16: Repeat row 4.

Row 17: Repeat row 1.

Row 18: Repeat row 2.

Row 19: k1, m1r, k1, m1r, k11, *(k2tog) 3 times (yo, k1) 6 times, (k2tog) 3 times. Repeat from * to last 13 stitches, k11, m1l, k1, m1l, k1.

Row 20: Repeat row 4. (410 stitches)



Finishing

Bind off all stitches using the Picot Bind Off.

Weave in all ends, and block to measurements. Use blocking wires to define the ripples on the lace edge by pulling out the picot points.
