



Cogges hat

A hat-full of cables in a colour that zings.

Pattern notes

This speedy project will just fly off your needles – it is knitted flat with just one quick seam to sew up at the end.

Hat

BRIM

Cast on 104 sts using 4mm needles.

Row 1 (RS): K1, *P1, K1; rep from * to end.

Row 2 (WS): P1, *K1, P1; rep from * to end.

Last 2 rows set rib. Work a further 10 rows in rib as set.

Change to 4.5mm needles.

Next row (RS): K2, M1 *K3, M1, [K2, M1] twice; rep from * 9 more times, M1, K2. 146sts. **Next row:** Purl.

CABLE PATTERN

Cable pattern is also shown on Chart.

Row 1: K1, *C6F, K6; rep from * to last st, K1.

Row 2: Purl.

Row 3: Knit.

Row 4: Purl.

Row 5: K1, *K6, C6B; rep from * to last st, K1.

Row 6: Purl.

Row 7: Knit.

Row 8: Purl.

These 8 rows set Cable patt. Cont to work in Cable patt until piece meas 18cm from cast-on edge, ending with RS facing for next row.

SHAPE CROWN

Next row (RS): K1, [K2tog] 72 times, K1. 74sts.

Work 9 more rows in st st.

Next row (RS): K1, [K2tog] 36 times, K1. 38 sts.

Work 6 more rows in st st.

Next row (WS): P1, [P2tog] 18 times, P1. 20sts.

Work 2 more rows in st st.

Next row (RS): K1, [K2tog] 9 times, K1. 11 sts.

Break yarn, thread through remaining stitches and fasten off.

With right sides held together, seam the two row-end edges.

Soak and block hat firmly over a pudding basin to shape. Weave in all ends.

Skills

Simple cables

Size

To fit adult head, circumference 50-55cm (19½-21 ½in)

Yarn

Fyberspates Scrumptious DK(45% silk, 55% merino; 100g skeins) Magenta (105) 1 x 100g skein

Needles and accessories

1 pair 4mm (UK 8/US 6) knitting needles

1 pair 4.5mm (UK 7/US 7) knitting needles

Cable needle (cn)

Tension

24sts and 30 rows to 10cm over cable pattern using 4.5mm needles

Special abbreviations

C6F: Slip 3 sts to cn and hold at front, K3; K3 from cn

C6B: Slip 3 sts to cn and hold at back, K3; K3 from cn



Standard abbreviations

alt	alternate	P	purl

C4B	slip 2 sts to cable needle and hold at back, K2; K2 from cable needle	P3tog	purl three stitches together
C4F	slip 2 sts to cable needle and hold at front, K2; K2 from cable needle	patt rep(s)	pattern repeat(s)
chst	chain stitch (crochet)	patt(s)	pattern(s)
cm	centimetres	PFB	purl into the front and back of the same stitch
cn	cable needle	pm	place marker

KFB	knit into the front and back of the same stitch	st st	stocking stitch (US: stockinette stitch)
kwise	knitwise	st(s)	stitch(es)
LH	left hand	tbl	through the back loop
M1	make 1 – as M1L	tog	together
M1L	make 1 left – pick up the strand between stitches from front to back and knit through the back of this loop	WS	wrong side
M1LP	make 1 purlwise – pick up the strand between stitches from front to back and purl through the back of this loop	w&t	wrap and turn – take yarn to opposite side of work (between the needles), slip next stitch purlwise from LH to RH needle, return yarn to original side of work, return slipped stitch to LH needle without twisting. The stitch is now wrapped with yarn. Turn work and start next row leaving any remaining stitches unworked. When this stitch is eventually worked, knit (or purl) the wrap and the stitch together as one stitch
M1R	make 1 right – pick up the strand between stitches from back to front and knit this loop	yo	yarnover
M1RP	make 1 right purlwise – pick up the strand between stitches from back to front and purl this loop		
MB	make a bobble (see pattern for specific instruction)
