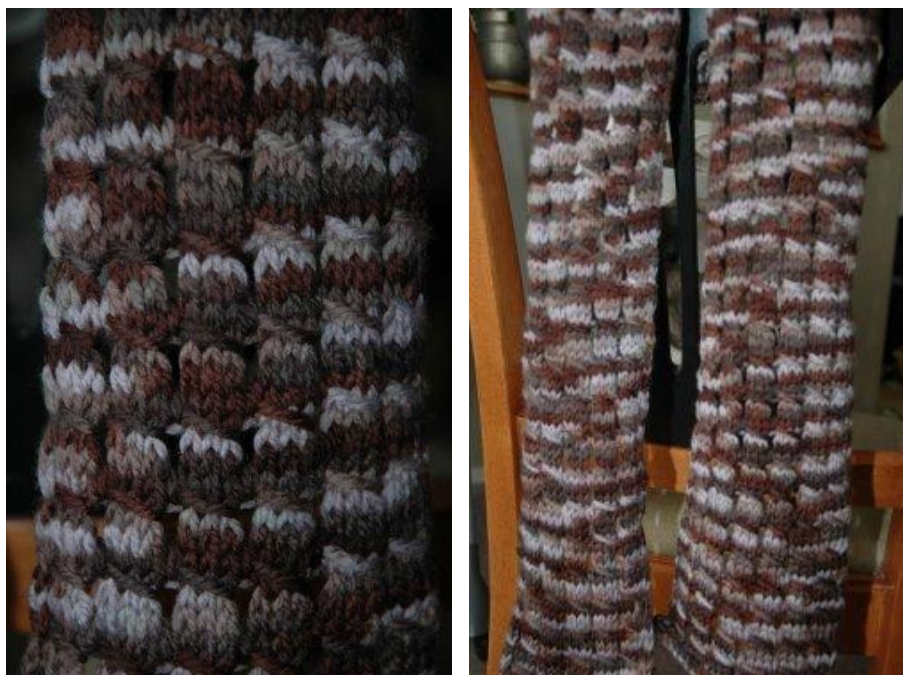


Scarves to Throws – Month 10

For Jimmy Beans Wool

Sandy found this stitch pattern, called Mrs. Hunter's Pattern, in Barbara Walker's Treasury of Knitting Patterns. She so enjoyed learning about its history she decided to use it for this month's scarf. Note that this and several of our other Scarve to Throws patterns are designed with an extra edge stitch on both sides to make it easier to sew them together. If you are not planning on sewing them together, you can cast on two fewer stitches, and skip the edge stitches.



Finished Measurements: 6 x 65 inches

Materials

- 1 ball of Lornas Laces Shepherd Worsted in Mineshaft
- Straight knitting needles, US size 9

Gauge

- Not super important...

Abbreviations

- K: knit
- P: purl
- yo - yarn over
- sl - slip one stitch purlwise

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- pssso - pass slipped stitch over
- es - edge stitch; knit on right side, purl on wrong side
- rs - right side

Directions

- Cast on 28 stitches
- Row 1 (rs): es, k26, es
- Row 2: es, p26, es
- Row 3: es, k1, *sl1, k3, pssso the 3 k stitches; repeat from * until 2 stitches remain, k1, es
- Row 4: es, p1, *p3, yo; repeat from * to last two stitches, p1, es

Repeat rows 1-4 until the scarf measures desired length. Bind off and sew in ends. Block for its full beauty.

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
